Real life stories

This catalogue features 30 documented examples from 17 European Member states with information on management, budget and transferable ideas to inspire other cities and regions to implement their own projects.

It is developed as part of <u>Living Spaces</u>, the European peerlearning scheme on high-quality architecture and built environment led by Eurocities. Enshrined in the European architectural policy, the programme follows up on the recommendations from the <u>Member states experts' group on</u> <u>architecture</u> to build capacity at local and regional level.





The practices featured in this catalogue are examples from the ground, selected through a <u>call for good practices</u>. They demonstrate the expertise and creativity of European cities and regions in shaping the built environment for everyone.

Follow up opportunities

12 peer-learning visits will be organised in 2024 to learn more about some of the examples from the catalogue, foster exchanges and European networking. The visits will open to participants from European countries in the coming weeks.
