Cultural Organisations show support for artistic freedom and autonomy





From a call to action by Culture Action Europe, a list of cosignatorys for safeguarding artistic and creative freedom and autonomy has been released, demonstrating broad support from creative organisations. and sp; and sp;

Last week, Creatives Unite published an article announcing Culture Action Europe's call to sign a form supporting safeguarding Artistic Freedom and Autonomy, up against growing restrictions on and state intervention in artistic freedom. The co-signatorys of the call have been released, showing a deep commitment to the rights of workers in creative industries towards freedom of expression. The initial survey, Creative Pulse, cited that 34% of respondents noted that they had been significantly or somewhat impacted by growing restrictions on the cultural industries. The call responded to this, asking EU institutions to concretise artistic freedom in their annual Rule of Law Report 2025, to safeguard the practices of art and creative sector workers.
