- On 9 May 2020, on the occasion of Europe Day which this year marked the 70th anniversary of the Schuman Declaration and the launch of the process of European integration, Europa Nostra together with all the members of the European Heritage Alliance have launched the European Heritage Alliance Manifesto 'Cultural Heritage: a
