This edition of Museum International titled "Provenance Research in Museums: Principles, Practices, and Possibilities" (Vol. 77, N° 307-308), published in collaboration with Taylor δ Francis/Routledge, seeks to expand the understanding of provenance research beyond ownership tracing, emphasizing its role in uncovering collecting histories and historical contexts. Contributions will explore how museums can engage in accountability, truth-telling, and collaborative research with diaspora and descendant communities to reinterpret collections, particularly those tied to colonial histories or ancestral remains.

Selected proposals will undergo a double-blind peer review process. Authors of accepted abstracts will receive detailed guidelines for full articles and have two months to complete their submissions.

Important Note: Contributions are voluntary. Articles will be published in English, with support for French and Spanish submissions.
