The financial landscape is shifting, with alternative finance models such as crowdfunding, peer-to-peer lending, and impact investing decentralizing capital distribution. These changes create new opportunities, especially for those seeking to buy property in non-urban areas for Cultural and Creative Industry (CCI) projects.

Crowdequity, a key alternative finance model, allows communities and entrepreneurs to pool resources and fund property purchases and creative projects through collective investment. With the alternative finance market projected to grow 20% from 2023–2030, understanding how to leverage

these models is essential.
