1. RESEO Europe and Beyond Programme

Sector: Opera, Music, and Dance Education

Deadline: September 8, 2024

Brief description:

The <u>RESEO</u> Europe and Beyond Programme aims to provide international visibility, networking, and peer-to-peer learning opportunities for organizations, artists, and arts professionals in the opera, music, and dance education field. The program offers grants to attend the RESEO Conference 2024 in Porto, Portugal.

Why we love it:

This program promotes cultural exchange and professional development across Europe and beyond, focusing on increasing geographical diversity in the performing arts education network. It's an excellent opportunity for professionals from specific





countries to gain international exposure and share innovative practices.

Who can apply:

Organizations, artists, and arts professionals active in the opera, music, and dance education field based in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Georgia, Kosovo, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey, and Ukraine.

Deadline: September 6, 2024

3. Camargo Foundation Fellowship

Sector: Cross-disciplinary (Arts and Humanities)

Deadline: October 1, 2024

Brief description:

The <u>Camargo Foundation</u> Fellowship offers a 10-week residency for artists, scholars, and thinkers to explore and create in a contemplative environment. The program aims to cultivate interdisciplinary exploration in the arts and humanities, fostering connections between research and creation. For the 2025-2026 edition, 14 applicants will be selected.

Why we love it:

This fellowship allows deep, uninterrupted focus on creative and scholarly work in a beautiful setting. It encourages crosscultural and interdisciplinary exchange, making it an invaluable experience for participants to broaden their perspectives and enrich their work.

Who can apply:

- -Scholars: PhD holders or candidates focusing on French and Francophone cultures or Mediterranean cross-cultural studies.
- -Thinkers: Accomplished professionals in cultural and creative fields engaged in critical thought.
- -Artists: Practitioners with at least 5 years of professional experience and a strong track record of creative practice and research-based work.

This event, part of the Horizon Europe-funded ARCHE project, will present the preliminary findings of the new Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA) for the European Partnership for





Resilient Cultural Heritage (RCH).

Sector: All Cultural and Creative Sectors (Cross-sectoral)

Deadline: September 30, 2024, 23:59 CET

Cities Ahead is the <u>Goethe-Institut's</u> programme for creative cities, supporting ambitious European urban centers in boosting their international visibility and cultural appeal. The program offers a two-day academy with expert knowledge on international cultural urban development, followed by an optional worldwide open call for innovative creative projects.

The programme combines capacity building for city officials with the potential for direct creative interventions. It's a chance for cities to enhance their cultural strategies while offering creatives the possibility to contribute to urban development.

Who can apply:

Representatives of local municipalities can apply on behalf of their city.
